Celebrating 20 years

History society's work over last two decades on show at open day

A LOCAL history society will celebrate its 20th anniversary with an open day and the launch of a new project.

Llandysul Local History Society, which turned 20 earlier this year, will hold an open day next Wednesday, 10 April at the town's Porth Hotel.

The event is from noon to 8pm Entrance is free and everyone is welcome.

The society was begun by Ann Owen and Jane Kerr who held its inaugural meeting in the King's Arms, Llandysul in January 1999, which led to the first exhibition of photographs of the village displayed in the library building.

Society chairman Jane Kerr says the open day will show the work of the group over the last two decades.

"We're holding this open day so that people can see and explore the research which we have done over the last 20 years," she said.

"We'll be there to answer questions and help people with their research, if we can."

The open day is also an opportunity to announce the society's new project which will focus on sports clubs and

teams from Llandysul and the surrounding area.

Society secretary Lesley Parker said: "Whilst we have been researching other projects such as the soldiers from World War I, and the local pubs, we have come across snippets of information about sports clubs, teams, and events from football to quoits!

"We even found that there were regular horse racing meets in Llandysul at the beginning of the 20th century.

"There is also information to collect from more recent times too.

"We will have a scanner and camera available at the open day to record anything which people bring."

The society's digital archive now holds copies of over 4,400 items kindly donated by many people over the last 20 years. The society organises an annual programme of speakers as well as holding research meetings and have held exhibitions in the library.

The current exhibition is about the men and women who served in World War I.

Other projects have included the countywide 'Pint of History' project, the results of which can be found on the 'Pint of History' website, transcribing and publishing the records of births, marriages and deaths and of the gravestones on CD, and working with Llandysul Community Council in creating information boards for the park.

Society members also conduct local history walks around Llandysul, and are currently researching a new walk for the Llandysul and Pont-Tyweli Walkers are Welcome Walking Weekend in September.

Évery year the society receives a number of family history enquiries from all over the world and sometimes these people visit the area and members are able to take them to their ancestors' homes.









Turning on Mains Water November 1927 – reported in the Cardigan & Tivyside Advertiser: "The streets of the town were bedecked with flags and bunting on Wednesday afternoon, and there was a large gathering at the Square near the Post Office".
